## Background

- As of 5 October 2018, BNPB or the National Disaster Management Agency reported 1,763 fatalities, 265 missing persons and 2,632 major injuries. As many as 62,659 displaced persons are sheltered in 147 evacuation sites.
- 2 provinces were directly affected by the earthquake and tsunami:
  - Central Sulawesi Province, there are 4 districts / city; Donggala District, Palu City, Sigi District and Parigi Moutong District;
  - West Sulawesi Province, there is 1 district; North Mamuju District
- The Governor of Central Sulawesi has announced an initial 14 days of emergency response period from **28 September 2018 to 11 October 2018**. The Governor appointed Commander of Military Resort 132 / Tadulako as Incident Command with the Incident Command Post in Korem 132 / Tadulako.
- International and foreign humanitarian organisations are requested to respect the decision of Government of Indonesia on limiting the presence of foreign humanitarian workers in the affected areas. International humanitarian organisations with local partners out on the ground may mobilize surge capacity from outside the country and only to be stationed in Jakarta (or headquarter) and not to the affected areas.
- PLN (State owned electricity company) has succeeded in repairing 100% of sub-stations and expect that the electricity network to be restored to at least 90%. Telecommunication network is improving with partial restoration. Fuel is still difficult to find in the affected areas with the long queue and the authority has set the regulation, that each car may not exceed IDR 100,000 and for the motorcycle, the maximum is 5 litres.
- Market activities in Palu City have been re-activated with limited items.

## Priorities in Emergency

- Procurement of electric generators and fuel

2. Medical assistances
3. Environment management, especially for vector-borne diseases, unsafe water causing diarrhoea and other communicable diseases
4. Food
5. WASH:
  - a) Distribution of clean water for consumption, cleaning and bathing
  - b) Water treatment
  - c) Portable latrines
6. Non-food items (NFI):
  - a) Shelter kits (tarpaulins, mattresses, blankets and ropes)
  - b) hygiene kits
7. Shelter management

## ACT Indonesia Forum (ACTIF) Responses

---

Currently, there are three members requesting for an appeal through ACT Alliance Humanitarian Response Mechanism, namely CWS, Pelkesi and YAKKUM/YEU, with the possibility for other members to join at the later stage based on the need in the ground and the capacity of the organisation to respond.

CWS, ICCO, Pelkesi and YEU have been on the ground in conducting rapid need assessment, fulfilling the basic needs as well as maintaining the health and the wellbeing of the at-risk communities.

### CWS

CWS deployed 3 personnel from Makasar, with expertise in logistics, shelter, and water supply & sanitation.

*Location(s) of response : Sigi District*

*Responses by CWS :*

- Continue to distribute water supply in three locations; Jono'oge, Sidera and Loru in Sigi District providing for approximately 2,000 people through distributing a total 10,000 litres of water.
- Installing three water tanks and tap stations in three water distribution locations.
- Coordination with Water Works (PDAM) in Kawatuna to support CWS water distribution.
- CWS relief items have reached Palu and unloaded to be stored in CWS temporary warehouse.
- Distributed 37 tarpaulins, 148 blankets, 74 mattresses for 37 households in Sidera Village.
- Join the WASH cluster coordination in Palu.

### ICCO

ICCO deployed two staffs from Bali office to join in the Effata medical post in Palu City (Pelkesi's post) in order for field coordination and to plan for further assessment.

### Pelkesi (Indonesian Christian Association For Health Service)

Pelkesi has deployed 3 medical teams (Sinar Kasih, Kalooran Amurang, and Immanuel-Lampung Hospitals) to Palu since 1 October 2018 with support personnel from Jakarta and Palu (6 persons).

*Location(s) of response : Palu City and Sigi District*

*Responses by Pelkesi :*

- Provision of health services to treat 65 patients in Effata health post.

- Pelkesi health team together with health persones from Woodward Hospital conducted mobile health service in Maranatha village in Sigi District with total 21 patients and mobilized one ambulance for any referral purposes. The top four diseases are; Myalgia (muscle pain), upper respiratory tract infection, Dyspepsia (digestive tract inflammation) and Cephalgia (pain and discomfort in the head).
- 2 anaesthetists from Pelkesi hospital have been supporting Samaritan Hospital in the operating room.

## YAKKUM

YAKKUM Emergency Unit has deployed 1 medical team (2 medical doctors, 1 midwife) and mobilize local volunteers since 1 October 2018.

*Location(s) of response* : Palu City and Sigi District

*Responses by YEU* :

- Distribution of tarpaulins, mineral water and flashlights in STQ shelter for 26 households
- Distribution of tarpaulins, mineral water and food supply in Palu City (2 shelter sites in Jl. Sisingamangaraja and Jl. Garuda) for total 129 displaced persons.
- Distribution of 8 tarpaulins and 10 flashlights in Jono'oge in Sigi District.
- Food supply distribution to 150 households (approximately 750 persons) in Panau Village in Tawaeli Sub-district of Palu City.
- Coordination with local church for the preparation of the community prayers after the mass burial as part of the psychosocial assistance to the families of the victims.
