Background

- The Governor of Central Sulawesi has announced to extend the emergency response period from 13 October 2018 to 26 October 2018. The Governor appointed Commander of Military Resort 132 / Tadulako as Incident Command with the Incident Command Post in Korem 132 / Tadulako.
- . 2 provinces were directly affected by the earthquake and tsunami:
 - Central Sulawesi Province, there are 4 districts / city; Donggala District, Palu City, Sgi District and Parigi Moutong District;
 - 2. West Sulawesi Province, there is 1 district; North Mamuju District
- As of 16 October 2018, BNPB or the National Disaster Management Agency reported 2,102 fatalities, 832 missing persons (including those buried due to licquefaction) and 4,612 major injuries. As many as 281,981 displaced persons in 5 main areas; Palu City (80,548 displaced persons), Sigi District (133,967 displaced persons), Donggala Timur (53,660 displaced persons), Donggala Barat (12,344 displaced persons) and in Parigi Moutong District (1,462 displaced persons).
- As many as 19,053 flee from the affected areas to other cities/ports across Indonesia, such as in Makassar, Balikpapan, Manado, Jakarta, Surabaya and Kendari.
- Some schools (mostly with minor damage) already operated with tents. Market activity, banks, religious places, the communication lines, electricity and fuel distribution have gradually operated.
- The government did the fogging in at-risk areas with potential vector-borne diseases like Talise, Mamboro, Lawalae, Taipa, Kayumalue, Pantoloan and Wani.
- . Temporary shelters have been set up by the government and other humanitarian organisations.

Priorities in Emergency

- Medical assistances with the focus on the prevention of potential outbreaks, as well as home visit to patients with difficulty in mobility.
- Shelter management and environment management, especially for vector-borne diseases, unsafe water causing diarrhoea and other communicable diseases and also garbage management
- 3. Food
- 4. WASH:
 - a) Distribution of clean water for consumption, cleaning and bathing
 - b) Water treatment
 - c) Portable latrines
- 5. Non-food items (NFI):
 - a) Shelter kits (tarpaulins, mattresses, blankets and ropes)
 - b) hygiene kits

ACT Indonesia Forum (ACTIF) Responses

Three members are requesting for an appeal through ACT Alliance Humanitarian Response Mechanism, namely CWS, Pelkesi and YAKKUM/YEU. ACTIF has set up regular coordination on the ground and continue the coordination through online conferences.

CWS

CWS deployed 6 personnel, with expertise in logistics, shelter, and WASH and work with 2 local partners.

Location(s) of response: Palu City, Donggala District and Sgi District Responses by CWS:

- 1. WASH
- Water distribution with an approximately 60,000 litres of clean water since 4 October 2018.
- Operate 5 water trucks with the capacity 60,000 to provide for clean water to around 3,291 people daily in 7 CWSwater tank locations in Palu City and Sigi District¹.
- Distribute a total 299 hygiene kits packages in Sgi District; Kabobona village (132 packages),
 Sdera village (55 packages), and Karawana village (112 packages).
- 2. Shelter & NFI
- Distribution of 100 tarpaulins and 100 ropes, 1,000 blankets, 200 plastic mats, 50 packs diapers, and 50 packs women sanitary napkins for 132 HH (675 people) in Sidera & Kabobona village, Biromaru sub-district in Sigi (10-11/10).
- Distribution of 272 USAID tarpaulins and 272 ropes in Sigi District to 136 HH (510 people) in Dolo sub-district - Karawana village (16/10).
- USAID tarpaulins distribution in Donggala District –targeting 225 HH in Balaesang Tanjung sub-district - Walandano village and 43 HH in Sindue Tombusabora sub-district – Tibo village (17/10).
- USAID tarpaulins distribution in Donggala District –targeting 35 HH in Strenja sub-district Ombo village and 35 HH in Lompio village (18/10).

Planned intervention:

 USAID tarpaulins distribution in Donggala District –targeting 70 HH in Balaesang Tanjung subdistrict – Rano village; 142 HH in Ponolulu village; 91 HH in Palau and 20 HH Manimbaya village (19/10).

Pelkesi (Indonesian Christian Association For Health Service)

Pelkesi has deployed 7 medical teams (Snar Kasih Tentena Hospital, Kalooran Amurang Hospital, Immanuel Lampung Hospitals, Baptis Batu Hospital, Griya Waluyo Ponorogo Hospital, PELKESI Region III, and PELKESI Region IV) to Palu, and support personnel from Jakarta and Palu (6 persons). Pelkesi also mobilizes 5 local volunteers.

Location(s) of response: Palu City, Donggala District and Sgi District Responses by Pelkesi:

Health

- Mobile health services to treat 514 patients in Palu City (Baiya), Donggala District (Lero Tatari, Balaesang), and Sigi District (Salua, Sibalaya Barat, Sibalaya Utara, Lambara, Sibowi).
- Health Post in Effata Church are operating in the afternoon after the teams returned from their mobile clinic.
- Primary Health Care (PHC) Assessment for prevention and promotional efforts to reduce morbidity due to communicable and non-communicable disease in collaboration with Woodward Nursing Academy.
- · Provide PHC assistances in 5 community health centres.
- · Assistance to Woodward and Samaritan hospitals in developing reconstruction plan.

YAKKUM

YAKKUM Emergency Unit has deployed 3 medical teams (consisting of 3 medical doctors, 5 nurses) and mobilizes 32 local volunteers.

Location(s) of response: Palu City, Donggala District and Sigi District Responses by YEU :

- 1. Health
- Rapid Need Assessment (RNA) to assess the elderly condition in emergency while at the same time conducting blood pressure check in 6 locations; Palu City (Kawatuna and Pajeko), Donggala District (Labuan Lelea and Labuan Panimba) and Sigi District (Sibalaya and Mpanau). As many as 428 questionnaires have been gathered and currently are being analysed.
- Mobile health services to treat 940 patients in Palu City (Kawatuna), Donggala District (Sumari, Lero, Tondo) and Sigi District (Pesaku, Mantikole, Bora, Rahmat, Stuwu, Pandede, Baliase)
- Assessing the disability and the potential disability in conjunction with the mobile health services.
- . Provision of assistive devices; 2 crutches and 1 walker to patients in Mantikole and Pandede.
- 2. Food
- · Provision of 428 packages of supplementary food for elderly being interviewed during RNA.

Planned intervention:

- Distribution of assistive devices to patients that have been assessed.
- Provision of physiotherapy sessions in conjunction with mobile health service.
- Distribution of hygiene kits and shelter kits.

- Each member will follow cluster coordination in accordance to their focus of response.
