Emergency response to Tsunami-Affected Communities in South Lampung

Highlights

- Status of emergency has ended on 19 January 2019, the transition phase of post-disaster recovery has begun.
- About 217 households in Kunjir Village (Rajabasa Sub-district) have their houses destroyed/damaged by the tsunami. There are several emergency shelter posts in Kunjir Village, one of which located behind Rajabasa 1 Public High School. About 29 households (74 people; 33 women and 41 men) staying in 7 tents in the emergency shelter post. The others stay with their relatives or rent temporary houses.
- Until 20 January 2019, 6 tsunami survivors were still being treated at Bob Bazar Regional Hospital in Kalianda. Most survivors have been able to go home and moving to *Wisma Atlet*.
- Temporary Shelter (*Huntara*) is still in the development process. In Kunjir Village, shelters are planned to be built in the side area of Rajabasa 1 Public High School.
- The local government also prepares Hotel 56 as one of the temporary shelters.
- The Social Agency provides Rp 15.000.000 of death compensation for survivors who lost their family members in the incident.

Current Situation

- Mostly school activity has started, while some schools which were damaged by the tsunami in Kunjir Village had yet to start activity.
- Economic activities have begun to run as usual. Fishermen who did not lose their boats continue to catch fish yet not too distant.
- Community Health Center as well as Village Health Center in each sub-district and village has been running as usual including integrated health post for children under-fives.

Immediate Needs :

- Set up an inclusive shelter post thus children under-fives, pregnant women, older people and people with disabilities have a secured access.
- Waste management in shelter post.
- Health promotion and psychosocial support.

YAKKUM Humanitarian Assistancess:

1. Health Services

- Health services provided in collaboration with the midwives of Village Health center. From 15-19 January 2019 (emergency status) in Health Post of YEU and Mardi Waluyo Hospital in Rajabasa Village for 195 patients, consists of 77 men and 118 women, with details as follow:

- Most common diseases: respiratory tract infection, fever, eczema, diarrhea, gastritis

2. Preparation of an inclusive Shelter Post in Rajabasa 1 Public High School of Kunjir Village through several activities such as:

- Community work to lay gravel path between tents to avoid slippery after raining.
- Community work to dig a small moat all the way around the tents thus the water flows away from the tents.
- Built closed bathroom to make it secure for girls and women.
- Set up lighting lamps in each tent and between the tents.
- Provided information board to cover number of survivors, complaint-handling poster, and health promotion posters.
- Discussed with the survivors about the complaint-handling mechanism. Both agreed that:
 1. Complaints related to YEU's assistance will be discussed directly together with the community, village authority and post coordinator, and YEU or by communicating to Survivor Coordinator (Mr. Sahadi) to forward the message to YEU.
 2. Complaints related to YEU's staffs behaviors, or if there is any indication of abuse of authority/funds/sexual harassment must be accompanied by evidence and submitted by contacting YEU Emergency Response Coordinator.
- Distributed garbage bins and garbage bags.

Distribution of *Non-food items (NFI)* are as follow :

3. Distributed hygiene kits, vacuum flasks, and mattresses for 217 families (818 people; 428 men, 390 women, 58 elderly, and 40 infants/children under-fives) in Kunjir Village for those who were affected by the tsunami.

4. Distribution of cooking tools (stove, gas stove hose, pan, frying pan, spatula, rice ladle, filter spatula) as many as 7 packages in Kunjir Village.
5. Provide 243 food coupons (for lunch and dinner) and 47 coupons for hot water for patients and their families affected by tsunami who still being treated in Bob Bazar Hospital from 17-20 January 2019. The coupons may redeem at the local restaurant in front of the hospital.
6. Psychosocial support for the survivors through conseling, regular visit, and etc.

During the emergency response period, complaints and feedback from the community assisted were conveyed during regular discussions between survivors and YEU. There are also feedback or complaints that are personally conveyed to YEU staff during visit such as related to the quality and type of relief items, regular discussions preferably in the afternoon and evening thus many can join.

Future Plans

1. Add tent pads (using bamboo and plywood flooring) in 7 tents of the Shelter Post Rajabasa 1 Public High School of Kunjir Village.
2. Provision of food and hot water coupons for patients and families of tsunami survivors at Bob Bazar Hospital.
3. Non-food items distribution to Sukaraja Village and Sebesi Island in form of hygiene kits, vacuum flasks, mattresses, etc.
4. Distribution of masks and health promotion in collaboration with Village Health Center.
5. In collaboration with *NU Peduli* to carry out psychosocial support.
